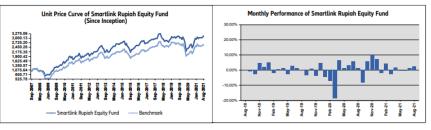

#### Manager Commentary

Central Bureau Statistics of Indonesia (BPS) announced Aug 2021 inflation at +0.03% mom (vs consensus inflation +0.03%, +0.08% in July 2021). On yearly basis, inflation was +1.59% yor (vs consensus inflation +1.60%, +1.52% in July 2021). Tore inflation was printed at +1.31% yor (vs consensus inflation +1.30%, +1.40% in July 2021). The lower monthly inflation was contributed by the deflication on volatile food group (lower prices of chickan and various bloticulture) and the slowing down of the inflation on administered price group (chicken, and various holticulture). The BI Board of Governors agreed on 17-18 Aug 2021 to hold the BI 7-Day Reverse Repo Rate to be 3.50%, and also hold the Deposit Facility (DF) and Lending Facility (LF) rates to be 2.75% and 4.25%, respectively. This policy is to maintain Rupich stability in the middle of globol uncertainty and also the lower inflation. Rupich appreciated against USD by +1.07% from 14.25 are and of July 2021 to 14,30 of and of Aug 2021. Indonesia's trade balance recorded surplus amounting to USD 2.589mn in July 2021 vs previous month surplus USD +1,316. The higher monthly trade surplus was caused by the lower imports number, especially on capital goads imports on the back of social restriction. While, exports number was cartually slowing down on the back of lower demand of iron and steel export from China. Even though, the CPO exports was increasing. Non-oil and gas trade balance in July 2021 recorded surplus undercorded deficit to USD -759mn in July 2021, which was lower than the deficit in June 2021 amounting to USD +2,382mm. The JCI ended the month higher at 6,150.30 (+1.32% MoM). Market movers were BBCA, BBRI, ASII, BMRI and TLKM as they rose 9.72%, 5.93%, 10.70%, 7.02%, and 4.94% MoM respectively. Global stock markets strengthened in August, despite still relatively highly volatile from the beginning to the middle month period as geopolitical treation rise from Afghanistan and China. In addition, rising daily new Covid-19 Cases globally and continuing market concerns over the outcome of the FOMC Meeting also fueled volatility. However, the dovish statement that came from Jerome Powell during the Jackson Hole symposium helped to build investors' confidence towards riskly assets such as equities. Looking domestically in Indonesia, the country's daily Covid-19 cases and Covid-19 positivity rate has fallen quite significantly in August, which prompted the government to begin easing mobility restrictions, portricularly in the Greater Jakarta care. On the vaccination progress, Indonesia continues to increase its daily vaccination rate, which now stands at above 1 million doses per day. The improvement in these two parameters has resulted in increasing foreign inflows into ICI in August. Market wise, the ICI currently trades at 2022 cernings multiple of 15, which is still below its mean and considering the already low foreign investors positioning combined with improvement in economic activity in 3Q21 and upcoming technology company IPOs, we believe this will improve investors' appetite in Indonesian stack market going forward. Sector wise, the Industrial Sector was the best performing sector during the month, gaining 7.42% MoM. Ticker wise, LABA (Ladangbaja Mumi) and MFMI (Multifiling Mitri) were the movers, appreciation, 50,00% and 30.71% MoM respectively. This was followed by the Financial Sector which round, the worst sector during the month was the Technology Sector, which recorded a decline of 6.32% MoM. Ticker wise, KIOS (Kioson Komersial) and EMTK (Elang Mahkota Teknologi) were the longards, which fell 21.80% and 21.09% MoM resp

Portfolio strategy wise, we have started to progressively shift to increase non defensive cyclical exposures on economic recovery expectation in 2021 and 2022. Generally speaking, our preference on equities that have pricing power, efficient balance sheet and good corporate governance has not changed regardless of condition. We are putting a larger emphasis on managing earnings expectations to a more conservative approach rather than growth seeking and assess value on that front also bearing in mind forex, leverage exposures and cash flow generation ability.
